Weld RE-5J School District is continuously expanding opportunities for students. Our Career and Technical Education (CTE) Pathways empower learners to discover their passions and talents through real-world experiences which connect learning to life. From elementary school through to graduation day, Weld RE-5J students are preparing for success, wherever their dreams may take them, whether through:

- Further skills training
- University, Community College, Trade School
- Degree
 Industry Certifications
- Apprenticeships
- Earning industry certifications in high school

Elementary students are introduced to career concepts through field experiences, guest presentations and demonstrations, and project-based learning activities.

CTE exploratory courses at Milliken Middle School (MMS) flow seamlessly into Pathways at Roosevelt High School (RHS). CTE students at MMS have leadership opportunities through Career and Technical Student Organizations, learn directly from teachers and students at RHS, and engage with industry professionals. This gives our learners a jumpstart on high school and provides risk-free opportunities to explore career interests before making a commitment to a particular field.

Roosevelt High School students have multiple opportunities to develop valuable skills while gaining work experience, college credits, and industry certifications while still in high school. These options can save on college tuition costs while enabling students to reach their goals faster. We currently offer 15 CTE pathways at RHS and are continually expanding options.



CTE STUDENTS AT RHS CAN SAVE MONEY AND GET A HEAD START ON FURTHER EDUCATION AND CAREERS STEM, Project Based Learning, Experiential Learning, and technology are integrated into lessons across all grade levels in all schools.



Examples of technology integration include access to technology-based maker spaces, computer labs, and iPads. Clubs and CTE pathways deliver additional IT immersion.

As required by the Educational Accountability Act of 2009, Weld RE-5J School District has entered into an Accreditation Agreement with the state of Colorado focusing on raising student achievement through performance frameworks addressed in a Unified Improvement Plan for each school and a District Improvement Plan for the District. By addressing the goals in the Unified Improvement Plan and District Improvement Plan, the District and each school has the opportunity to not only help more students succeed academically, but also improve in the accreditation categories set by the State of Colorado.

The District participates fully in the Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS). Other information about student progress and program effectiveness is provided by data collected from other school and classroom-based assessments. Data is also collected through additional external assessments, which give us data to compare our students to other students on a national level. Additional assessments we use to gain information include the PSAT, ACT, NWEA, and other content-area assessments. These assessments provide the necessary data required for district and school accreditation and aid us in developing improvement plan goals.

Our state-of-the-art high school is due to be completed in August of 2023



This site for the new high school is approximately 80 acres with primary access/frontage on County Road 13 (Colorado Boulevard) and was donated by the Sauer family.

The current RHS High School will be converted to a new middle school.



Conversion work will begin in the summer of 2023 once the new Roosevelt High School is complete. Weld RE-5J School District received a \$19 million BEST Grant for the new middle school to total almost \$29 million in BEST Grants awarded since 2019. These grants are just one example of ways the district is continually working to make tax dollars stretch further to create the maximum benefit for students and the community.

Elementary Schools

Elwell Elementary School opened its doors on budget and on time for the 2022-2023 school year. Over \$9.5 million towards construction was funded by a competitive BEST Grant. Elwell's innovative spaces are creating more opportunities for collaboration between students, educators, and the community.

Ongoing renovations and updated furniture that provides flexibility are enhancing Milliken Elementary and Pioneer Ridge's learning environments to continue to provide engaging opportunities for all students.

No matter the school, our PreK-5 educators and students are leveraging their resources to focus on foundational literacy and mathematics instruction, exciting projectbased science and social studies experiences, as well as comprehensive STEM, arts, music, and physical education programming — all through a personalized, hands-on approach.
