WHAT IS IT?

- All MMS students will participate.
- 36 groups of students 12 per grade level — will each represent a country.
- Each country is part of a region.
 - 6th, 7th, and 8th grade countries will be grouped into 12 geographical regions.
- Students will begin meeting with their Olympic groups on April 25. Every Tuesday and Thursday, students will engage in varied activities that lead up to the day of events. Students will learn about their country and about each of the different MMS events.

OLYMPIC WEEK IS MAY 20-23

- Students will compete in "country" events against students in the same grade level representing other countries. Events will include the 100 yard dash, chess, sack race, free
 - chess, sack race, free throw shooting, 3-legged race, etc.
- 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students will also come together to form "regions." Regional competitions will include the Hawaiian relay, brain bowl, water balloon toss, 3 on 3 basketball, volleyball, mazeball, etc.
