SEMI High Tech U @ Nordson

Nordson Corporation and Colorado State University will be hosting SEMI High Tech U in your area. SEMI HTU is a successful STEM-based career exploration program for high school students that has been delivered worldwide over 240 times. Days one and three will take place at **Nordson** and day two at **CSU**.

There is **no cost to attend**. Applications are requested by May 30th, but we will continue to accept students until the class is full.

You do not have to be an "A" student to attend. We encourage all high school students to apply that have the potential - sometimes unrealized - to do well in a STEM career. During the **three-day program**, students will learn the fundamentals of statistics, solar technology, semiconductor manufacturing, microchip logic and more. Students who have gone through the program report they go back to school feeling more "future focused", and understand the educational pathway needed to move forward. Weld Works 4 Youth Summer Employment Program

Employment Services of Weld County provides paid work experience to qualified youth during June and July.

Orientations for all eligible youth will be held in May. A general skills test is included.

Qualification requirements:

- Weld County resident; priority of service provided to youth residing outside of Greeley
- 14 or 15 years old during June and July
- Receiving one (or more) of the following: TANF, Medicaid, Food Stamps, Foster Care, DHS Prevention Services (within the past 6 months)
- Copy of photo ID and Social Security Card must be included with application
